

In your classroom you will have students with different learning styles, disabilities, and ability levels. Your students will be more successful if you can incorporate their particular learning style into your teaching style. Each child is unique and you will uncover the child's needs by observing them and discussing with them what makes learning easier or more difficult for him. You can also use the activities in the Understanding Differences Unit (such as the Learning Styles Activity, Multiple Intelligence (MI) Inventory and MI Card Sort Activity) to help identify your students learning preferences.

In this section, we share some "tricks" or adaptations that we have found to work with many students who struggle because of their learning style needs. Remember within each classroom there are students with a multitude of learning styles. Therefore when you incorporate a variety of teaching styles into each lesson you will reach more students.
